IMPORTANT

In filling out this form be guided by the instructions contained in the **MANUAL ON CIVIL REGISTRATION AND VITAL STATISTICS** issued by the Civil Registrar-General.

Value of birth certificates.—Birth certificates are very valuable, hence they must be correctly and completely filled out in ink or typewriter and filed with the local civil registrar in two copies (original and one carbon copy).

The following are some of the important uses of a birth certificate:

1. Proof of family relations (paternity, maternity, and filiation). Such proof is required when claiming for succession or inheritance, pension and other rights incidental to family relations.
2. It serves as evidence of age which is required when (c) first entering school; (b) establishing the first right to vote; (e) taking civil service examination and entering government service; (d) getting life insurance; (c) securing passport; (f) establishing age when going to work in commercial or industrial establishments; (g) getting marriage license; (h) military training, etc.

NOTE.—In the case of an exposed child, the person who found the same shall report to the local civil registrar the place, date, and hour of finding and other attendant circumstances.

In case of an illegitimate child, the birth certificate shall be signed and sworn to jointly by the parents of the infant or only by the mother if the father refuses. In the latter case, it shall not be permissible to state or reveal in the document the name of the father who refuses to acknowledge the child, or to give therein any information by which such father could be identified, even if known.

False statements.—Any person who shall knowingly make false statements in the forms furnished and shall present the same for entry in the civil register shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one month nor more than six, or by a fine of not less than P200 nor more than P500, or both, in the discretion of the court. (Act 3753, Sec. 16)

Failure to Report.—Other Violations.—Any person whose duty is to report any fact concerning the civil status of persons and who knowingly fail to perform such duty, and any person convicted of having violated any of the provisions of this Act, shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten pesos nor more than two hundred. (Sec. 17, Act 3753.)

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
