### I. CALL TO ORDER

Commissioner Manuel D. Punzal, the Chairman of the Leyte State University Board of Regents, called the meeting to order at 2:20 p.m. and led the Board to a short prayer to start the 1st LSU Board of Regents Meeting.

#### II. ROLL CALL

Chairman Manuel D. Punzal requested Prof. Daniel M. Tudtud Jr, th Board Secretary, to call the roll to ascertain that there was a quorum. Th Board Secretary reported to the Chairman that ten (10) of the eleven (11 members of the ViSCA Board of Trustees (BOT) were present. Only the Regent Buenaventura Go-Soco, Jr. was absent as he was attending a meeting in Manila.

President Paciencia P. Milan took the opportunity to introduce to the LSU Board of Regents the superintendent of the LSU-Isabel Campus, D. Victor Ritaga and the new representatives of the Senate and Congress: *N* Edwin Codilla representing Senator Renato Cayetano and Atty. Eduard Dela Cruz, representing Congressman Harlin Abayon.

# III. ADOPTION OF THE PROPOSED AGENDA

Chairman Punzal requested the Board Secretary to read the iter calendared for the 1<sup>st</sup> LSU Board of Regents meeting. The Board Secreta then read the items calendared for this meeting.

Chairman Punzal requested the members of the Board of Regents go over the proposed agenda for consideration in the meeting and invit the members to present any other item for inclusion in the meeting provid that such does not require any background study.

President Paciencia P. Milan requested a correction in item (c) una Administrative Matters. This should have read: Request for the Creation a

<u>Upgrading of Some Administrative Positions</u> instead of Request for the Creation of Some Administrative Positions.

After ascertaining that there were no more items to be calendared for the 1<sup>st</sup> BOR Meeting, Chairman Punzal informed the Board that "the Chair now accepts a motion for the approval of the calendared agenda." Regent Jose Mazo moved for the approval of the calendared agenda and Regent Rheeno Nayre seconded the motion.

#### IV. CHAIR'S PRIVILEGE

Chairman Manuel D. Punzal took the opportunity to welcome the new members of the Board. He also made mention of the new status of the institution as a "newly born" state university and expressed his deep appreciation to the members of the BOR for having Chaired the last ViSCA Board of Trustees meeting as well as the 1<sup>st</sup> Board of Regents meeting of the Leyte State University.

Chairman Punzal informed the members of the Board of the new developments within the CHED. First, there were two new Commissioners who have been sworn into office. The two new commissioners are: (1) Dr. Carlito Puno, former President of the Philippine Christian University and the Coordinating Council on Private Education Association (COCOPEA); and (2) Dr. Ma. Cristina Padolina, former Chancellor of the U.P Open University.

Second, Chairman Punzal announced to the Board that he had to leave the Chairmanship of Boards of SUCs in Region VIII as the number of SUCs that he is supervising is more than that of the other CHED Commissioners. He expressed his thanks and deep appreciation for the wonderful time he had as Chairman of the ViSCA Board of Trustees.

Third, Chairman Punzal announced that the CHED has given autonomy status to 30 private Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) so that

they may be able to operate just like the SUCs. Three main criteria were used in screening the 50 HEIs given full autonomy status, namely: (1) high performance in licensure examinations for the past five years with no "zero passing" within the same time period; (2) must be Level 3 accreditation o having been identified by CHED as a Center of Excellence or Center o Development in any program by CHED; and (3) the HEI must have a tradition of excellence and integrity and without a tarnished record. These HEIs may now: (a) open new undergraduate programs without CHED approval provided that these new programs are approved by their respective Boards; (b) confirm the graduation of their own students; and (c) undertake the revision of their curricula. In Region VIII, no private HEIs qualified. However, in Region VII, the HEIs that qualified included: University of San Carlos, University of San Jose-Recoletos, and the Cebu Institute of Medicine in Cebu City; Silliman University in Dumaguete City; and the Divine Word College in Tagbilaran City. Most of the schools are in Metro Manila. With this move, the CHED can now concentrate on the supervision of the schools that really need help.

Fourth, Chairman Punzal shared the news that the Philippine Government is securing loans from the Asian Development Bank (ADB) to finance the training, re-training and the development of faculty of SUCs especially along the lines of teacher education and information and communications technology. The CHED is also trying to secure grants to finance the professionalization of SUC Presidents, Vice-Presidents, SUC administrators, as well as the CHED National and Regional Offices to make the management of SUCs and of CHED to be at par with the management of the best private HEIs. Hopefully, CHED will be able to secure a US\$ 75 million grant for this purpose and Leyte State University will be benefited by this.

Finally, Chairman Punzal expressed his appreciation for the orderly and creative Investiture Rites and congratulated everybody for having worked hard to make it a success.

# V. READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

Commissioner Punzal asked the members of the Board to look at the minutes of the last ViSCA Board of Trustees meeting, presented in Tab A, for correction.

The members of the Board of Regents did not have any correction on the minutes presented and so Regent de la Cruz motioned for the approval of the minutes as presented. Regent Rebecca Barbusa seconded the motion. Thus, the LSU Board of Regents passed

#### VI. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE APPROVED MINUTES

Chairman Punzal asked the members of the Board "to go over the approved minutes for any updates, follow ups, clarifications, and other motions that you would like to discuss pertaining to any of the resolutions."

#### 1. Investiture Ceremonies

Faculty Regent Perla M. Tan inquire whether the Board had approved a budget covering the expenses of the investiture ceremonies of the University President in August 2001. She recalled that in the previous investiture ceremonies for the College President in December 1999, the Board discussed and passed a resolution authorizing the expenditure.

Chairman Manuel D. Punzal requested for actual confirmation from President Milan if there was indeed any authorization from the Board for the release of funds to cover expenses incurred during the investiture rites.

The Board Secretary, Prof. Daniel M. Tudtud, Jr., informed the body that there was a resolution passed by the ViSCA Board of Trustees during the 165<sup>th</sup> BOT Meeting under Use of Income which indicated, among others, that "This covers the requirements for the investiture of the Leyte State University President which includes the mace, ring, collar and food as previously approved by the Board of Trustees." In the December 1999 investiture ceremonies, the Board passed a special resolution because there was no more Use of Income item presented for approval.

Regent Jose Mazo, Private Sector representative, inquired from the Chairman whether there is a need for the Board to officially confirm any referendum results. To this query, Chairman Punzal replied that the results of all referenda should be presented to the Board in the next meeting for reactions or comments and for confirmation and directed the Board Secretary to take note of this.

#### VII. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Paciencia P. Milan provided each Trustee a copy of the President's Activities covering the months of July 2001 to 15 September 2001. President Milan then proceeded to mention the highlights for the period covered as follows:

- (1) Attended the 13th Regional R&D Symposium held last 12 July 2001;
- (2) ViSCA Anniversary held last 30-31 July 2001;
- (3) Investiture rites held last August 2001; and Attended and participated in the Foundation Day activities of the external campuses.

#### VIII. NEW BUSINESS

#### A. Academic Matters

1. <u>Proposed Colleges/Institutes/Departments for the Leyte State University and the LSU Organizational Chart</u>

President Milan presented to the Board the proposed colleges/institutes/departments of the Leyte State University. President Milan explained that this proposal was discussed during the strategic planning workshop and approved by the Administrative Council.

Chairman Punzal directed all the members to go over the organizational chart presented in Tab D. Chairman Punzal commented that the lines of authority are not very clear and requested President Milan to explain.

President Milan replied that the offices under the Office of the President does not have any line authority over the Vice-Presidents or any other office for that matter. These are basically staff offices under the Office of the President.

Regent Jose Mazo commented why the external campuses are placed under "external affairs". Rather, these campuses should be under the Vice-President for Academic Affairs or the Office of the President. Regent Mazo also inquired on the reason(s) for the use of the position title, Vice-President for Instruction and not Vice-President for External Affairs.

To the first comment of Regent Mazo, President Milan was in agreement to place the external campuses under the Vice-President for Instruction. To the second comment, President Milan reasoned that Academic Affairs is a more encompassing title that covers Instruction and other academic concerns. Furthermore, it is proposed that the University have four Vice-Presidents: (1) Administration,

Finance and Business Affairs; (2) Instruction; (3) Research and Extension; and (4) Institutional Partnerships and External Affairs.

Chairman Punzal commented that the organizational structure looks "top heavy" in relation to enrolment and suggested that the number be reduced to three as follows: VP for Administration and Finance, VP for Academic Affairs and an Executive Vice-President.

Faculty Regent Perla M. Tan directed the members of th Board to look at Tab C which presents the propose colleges/institutes/departments under the LSU system. Regent Ta commented that there is quite a number of propose colleges/institutes/departments.

President Milan explained that an institute provides particular focus within a college and cited the Institute of Plar Breeding (IPB) and the Institute of Biological Sciences (IBS) of th UPLB College of Agriculture as examples. Furthermore, to be able t reduce the administrative manpower requirement for the differer proposed units, it was agreed that the headship of these units will b on concurrent capacity.

Regent Mazo suggested that the proposed units be reviewe by looking at the disciplines so that the most applicable structure ca be reached. Along this line, Regent Guindolino Gerona motioned for the appointment of Regent Mazo to "take charge of analyzing an improving the proposal upon consultation with the concerned unit of the university." Regent Rebecca Barbusa seconded the motion with no objections from the other members of the Board.

The Board of Regents agreed that the new proposal be brough up again in the next BOR meeting for final action.

### 2. Results of the National Budget Circular (NBC) 461 Evaluation

President Milan informed the body that the DBM has approved for implementation the upgraded faculty positions as a result of NBC 461 evaluation. However, in view of the lack of money to implement it beginning in November 2001, the administration is proposing for its implementation beginning December 2001. This has been keenly awaited by faculty members who have not been promoted since 1996.

President Milan then moved for the approval of implementation of the NBC 461 evaluation results effective December 2001. Regent Barbusa duly seconded the motion. There were no objections from the Board. The Board passed:

#### B. Administrative Matters

1. Request for the Conversion of the Vice-President Position (SG-27) to University Secretary I Position (SG-28)

President Milan informed the members of the Board that the Vice-President position, with Salary Grade 27, has been left vacant for the last 8 years. The former ViSCA President was then the holder of this plantilla item prior to his appointment as President. Since then,

nobody has been given this position since all the vice-president positions were designated and co-terminus with that of the President. It is, therefore, the proposal of the administration to convert this vacant plantilla item to the position of University Secretary (SG-28).

Faculty Regent Tan raised her objection on this move for the following reasons: (1) few universities have opted for this position; (2) the next president may not want the appointed university secretary to be his university secretary for whatever reason; (3) in the spirit of transparency, there are no "sensitive records" to speak of which have to be "protected".

President Milan replied that "handling sensitive records" in this instance refers to the need to house and maintain all the records of the university in one office and not about the lack of transparency. When a designated University Secretary exits, he may bring with him some of these materials to the detriment of the University or that records are not housed in a permanent place. Thus, it is necessary to have a permanent secretary to do this.

Chairman Punzal commented that there are two different kinds of secretaries being referred to by the Faculty Regent: (a) President's Secretary; and (2) University Secretary. The first one, definitely, is very loyal to the President and is co-terminus with the President, The second one, is the person entrusted to maintain the records and the traditions of the university in accordance with the institution's mission and vision. His loyalty is to the university and not to the President. The best way by which we can be assured of his loyalty to the institution will be to make a very specific job description. With this safeguard, the appointed University Secretary will be adequately guided on what he is supposed to do. In the event

that he is not doing what is expected of him based on the job description, then he can be removed from office for non-performance after going through due process.

Chairman Punzal further commented that by appointing a permanent University Secretary, the next President will not be able to "fool around" with the records of the university. Thus, the records are "better secured' than if the position was simply a designated one. A plantilla item Vice-President is more problematic in the sense that this person will always aspire for the presidency and may use his position to "throw his weight around" to get what he wants.

Regent Gerona inquired why the salary grade is high, SG-28 which is equivalent to Professor V position. To this query, Presiden Milan replied that this is the standard set by the Civil Service for this position title, University Secretary I.

Chairman Punzal, after hearing all the other discussions on the matter, called for a motion approving the conversion of the vacan Vice-President position to University Secretary I position.

President Milan moved for the approval of the conversion.

And Regent Mazo seconded the motion. Regent Tan voiced here objection on the approved motion. Hearing no other objections. Chairman Punzal no longer called for the division of the house or the matter and declared the proposal as approved. The Board passed

# 2. <u>Confirmation of the Appointment of Dr. Paciencia P. Milan from</u> College President to University President

President Milan informed the Board that the CHED approved her appointment as University President based on the referendum on this matter which was signed by all members of the Board. As discussed in the previous BOT meeting, there is a need for the Board of Regents to confirm the referendum results.

Chairman Punzal called for a motion to confirm the results of the referendum. Regent Mazo moved for the confirmation of the results of the referendum on the appointment of Dr. Paciencia P. Milan to University President. Regent Gerona seconded the motion.

# 3. Request for the Creation and Upgrading of Some Administrative (Plantilla) Positions

President Milan presented the justifications for the creation and upgrading of some plantilla item administrative positions. President Milan explained that the proposed upgrading of positions has passed the Civil Service Commission but needs a Board Resolution for final approval. The decision to upgrade these positions came about due to some savings in Personal Services (PS) after the implementation of NBC 461. These positions have not been upgraded in the last 10 years or more unlike the academic faculty who are periodically evaluated by PASUC. The DBM has also turned down the proposal to create new positions using savings from PS.

Regent Tan queried on the basis of the upgrading whether this was based on the availability of money or based on performance. President Milan replied that the incumbents will be evaluated by the Non-Academic Personnel Board (NAPB) to determine if they qualify. The budget for next year will already incorporate the new rates.

Chairman Punzal noted two main points in the proposal: (a the availability of savings from the PS; and (b) the NAPB and the Civi Service still have to scrutinize the records of the persons to b nominated if they qualify for upgrading. On the first issue, the saving from PS could be reverted to the National Treasury if it is not utilized On the second issue, this is not an automatic thing since everybody nominated for upgrading will have to pass through the NAPB and the Civil Service for screening.

President Milan then moved for the approval of the proposal for the creation and upgrading of some administrative (plantillal positions. Regent Edwin Codillal seconded the motion. After the motion was seconded, Regent Jose Mazo pointed out that there is need to enumerate all the positions being approved. Hearing nother comments/objections, the Board passed

President Milan presented to the Board a copy of the Manual of Operations for Income Generating Projects and explained that this was a collective effort by all SUCs in Region VIII. Specific consultants on special topics were invited to input their thoughts on the manual.

Regent Jose Mazo inquired whether this manual will be revised from time to time to reflect "new trends". Chairman Punzal answered that this should be the case. Hearing no other comment, Regent Gerona moved for the approval of the manual of operations of IGP projects of SUCs in Region VIII. Regent Barbusa seconded the motion. Hearing no objections, the Board passed

Approving the adoption of Manual of Operations of IGP Projects as crafted by PASUC VIII on condition that it will be revised from time to time.

### 5. Proposed Revision of Fees on the Use of the Facilities of the Center for Continuing Education (CCE)

President Milan explained to the body that the Board approved the rental rates for the different facilities of the CCE for a year. The one year is over and the CCE Director has observed that the fees collected are rather low and cannot meet the attendant expenses for the use of these facilities. Thus, there is a new proposal to increase these fees. President Milan also informed the Board that the new fees do not incorporate with it the payment of electricity as this expense is billed in accordance with usage.

Regent Mazo requested clarification on certain provisions c the new proposal specifically pertaining to the use of the training hal and the function rooms at the second floor. The way it is worded makes the proposal quite ambiguous. Regent Mazo suggested that the proponent re-word the proposal without prejudicing its approval.

President Milan moved for the approval of the proposed revision of fees on the use of the facilities of the Center fo Continuing Education (CCE) with revisions on the wording of the guidelines. Regent Gerona seconded the motion. Hearing no objections, the Board passed

The administration is levying this fee since said gardeners are heav users of water. The original proposal was P10.0/sq. meter/month but after due consultation with the concerned faculty and staff, the rat was changed to P10.00/sq. meter/year.

President Milan moved for the approval of the proposal Regent Gerona seconded the motion. Hearing no objection, the Board passed

9. <u>Proposal to Charge Water Fees to Households Supplied with Water from LSU Water Lines Crossing the Perimeter Fence</u> between LSU and Brgy. Guadalupe

President Milan explained that at present, LSU residents are already being charged with a water fee at the rate of P50.00 for households without lodgers and P100.00 for households with lodgers. The administration would like to cut all illegal water connections. In the meantime, all these households with illegal water connections will be charged the same rate as the Baybay Water District. The concerned households already are aware of this and have not asked for a reconsiderations.

President Milan moved for the approval of the proposal to charge water fees to households supplied with water from LSU water lines crossing the perimeter fence between LSU and Brgy. Guadalupe. Student Regent Rheeno Nayre seconded the motion. Hearing no objections, the Board passed

10. Omnibus MOA Between LSU and Department of Education (DepEd) on the Transfer of Secondary School Teachers and Transfer/Use of Facilities in the External Campuses

President Milan informed the Board that there is already an understanding between the CSIs and DepEd regarding the transfer of secondary school teachers to the Department as well as the transfer/use of certain facilities in the external campuses. We are now presenting, for Board approval, the Omnibus MOA governing the transfer of teachers and the transfer/use of some school facilities.

President Milan requested Dr. Victor Ritaga, Superintendent of th LSU-Isabel campus, for some feedback on the MOA.

Dr. Ritaga commented that seven of the eight teachers wh had earlier been identified to be weaned to the DepEd have qualifie to become instructors by virtue of the implementation of NBC 461. I view of this development, the LSU-Isabel campus head requested that these teachers be retained. They can now be utilized more fully i the college department.

President Milan, however, indicated that the DepEd does not agree with this move as it had already identified these teachers at those teaching solely in the secondary level. President Mila informed the board that per agreement with Dr. Ritaga, he will make the necessary representations before the DepEd to iron this out.

Dr. Ritaga indicated that this matter can still be negotiate with the DepEd. Chairman Punzal pointed out that the budget of th 8 teachers has already been given to DepEd effective January 2002. Chairman Punzal, however, indicated that the Board will be supporting the move of Dr. Ritaga to retain the seven teachers when have already qualified to become college instructors.

President Milan also informed the body that in the LSU-Villab campus, there is a move for the increase in the land area to be transferred to the high school from 3 hectares to 6 hectares to accommodate faculty housing and student cottages and for production area. Congressman Veloso has likewise requested for 10-hectare land to be donated to him so that he will be able to buil housing for the college and high school faculty. This is for information to all in the event that anybody will be approached for the purpose of lobbying.

President Milan moved for the approval of the MOAs between LSU and the DepEd governing the transfer of the secondary school teachers of the LSU external campuses to DepEd. The motion was unanimously approved. Hearing no objections, the Board passed

President Milan presented to the body the student handboo that the Office of Student Affairs (OSA) has been using. Presider Milan indicated that the OSA would now like to update this studer handbook incorporating the new laws and regulations which ha been passed in the last eight years.

Regent Rheeno Victor Nayre indicated that as President of th Student Council he was not consulted on the matter. He als commented that the proposal should provide as side-by-sid comparison so that it will be easy to compare the old and the new.

Chairman Punzal, after noting the comments of the Studer Regent, decided to defer action on the proposal until after th concerned office shall have presented a side-by-side comparison of the contents of the old and new handbook.

#### 3. Sabbatical Leave of Dr. Guindolino Gerona

Regent Guidolino R. Gerona took the opportunity to inforr the Board that he would like to take a Sabbatical Leave of absence effective 01 November 2001 until 30 April 2002. His papers are sti in process and could not make it for this Board meeting. He however, asked that the Board permit him to take his Sabbatical leav and that once all the papers are complete, will be the subject of referendum on the matter.

Chairman Punzal inquired if there were any objections on the proposed Sabbatical leave of absence of Regent Gerona. Hearing none, the Board provisionally approved the Sabbatical Leave of absence of Dr. Guindolino Gerona pending the submission of the

needed endorsement papers which will be appended in a

Referendum to be conducted for this purpose.

#### PLANNING OFFICER III

It is requested that a Planning Officer III be created to be responsible for supervising and participating in the work of technical staff engaged in the preparation of short, medium and long-range plans and in the evaluation of programs, projects and activities in accordance with set standards.

Due to the absence of a Planning Officer, the unit is presently headed by an Assistant Professor, who aside from actual teaching job, is also designated as the University Secretary.

With the expected voluminous work due to the conversion of ViSCA to LSU, the creation of a Planning Officer III is urgently requested.

#### REGISTRAR I

The expansion of curricular offerings and offering of new courses starting June 2002 have continuously increased the volume of student records to be updated and filed every year. The complexity of handling the student records enrolled in the different programs [3 graduate programs with 19 different fields of specialization having 2 schemes (on-campus and off-campus); 14 indergraduate degree programs with 20 different major fields of specialization in the main campus] and the additional responsibility in the supervision of handling the records of the external campuses require a Registrar I position to insure prompt and accurate record keeping and retrieval.

#### EGISTRAR II

With the continuing increase of students enrollees every ear and the opening of new courses starting June 2002, the reation of Registrar II position is urgently needed to cope up he increasing volume of academic and administrative esponsibilities of the Registrar's Office. Furthermore, the onversion of ViSCA into a University and the integration of 4 HED-supervised schools as its external campuses expands the area f responsibility of the Registrar's Office in the main campus in aybay, Leyte.

#### SECURITY OFFICER III

LSU occupies 1085 hectares of land which start seashore and extend to the top of Mt. Pangasugan. With of coverage, not to mention the security of buildings, students, LSU maintains 37 security guards to be able t their guarding activities.

#### Counter Proposal of ViSCA Gardeners

President Milan reminded the body of the approved ADCO proposal to levy P10.00 per sq. meter/month on all housing units with commercial gardens. At the time of its approval, Dr. Diputado, the representative of the ViSCA gardeners, was on official travel and was not able to present the group's counter proposal. President Milan then went through proposal of Dr. Diputado.

Some of the salient points discussed about the proposal include the following:

- (1) The amount of water used in these commercial undertakings have drastically reduced the water pressure available to domiciles and dormitories. In some instances, the water hoses are not even closed and water is just made to flow freely. There is an urgent need to install water meters to these units so that the water use will be carefully monitored.
- (2) The areas utilized for the gardens have gone beyond the original boundaries originally allotted to the housing units concerned. In one case, the garden has literally spilled over to the road and is causing a traffic hazard to the residents.
- (3) The cutting of trees, for the purpose of expanding the garden, is strictly prohibited.
- (4) The counterproposal is based on the Benguet State University rate.

After due deliberation, the ADCO approved the rate of P10.00 per sq. meter per year covering all areas occupied on trial basis effective January 2001 until December 2001 without prejudice to its refiling in subsequent periods. President Milan, after ascertaining that there were no other comments and objections, approved the proposal.

ADCO Action:

The ADCO approved the rate of P10.00 per sq. meter per year covering all areas occupied as commercial garden on trial basis effective January 2001 until December 2001 without prejudice to its refiling in subsequent periods.

# PROPOSAL TO CHARGE WATER FEES TO THOSE HOUSEHOLD SUPPLIED WITH WATER FROM LSU WATER LINES CROSSING THE PERIMETER FENCE BETWEEN LSU & GUADALUPE

As reported by the Physical Plant Office, there are houses and cottages outside the Perimeter Fence between LSU and Guadalupe supplied by LSU with water. Because of the reduced appropriation of the university for its maintenance and operating expenses, there is a need to generate funds to maintain university facilities including its water services. This is the very reason why staff residing on campus are now charged water fees.

There is therefore a need for the university to fully maximize its resources. If LSU residences on campus are charged water fees, the more residences outside the campus should be made to pay. Hence, this proposal to charge as follows:

a) LSU staff without lodgers/boarders with water connection from LSU

P50.00/month

b) LSU staff with lodgers/boarders with water connection from LSU

P100.00/month

c) Outsiders with water connection from LSU

same rate as charged by the water district.

The PPO is directed to immediately inform those household concerned. If they are not amenable, the water connection should be cut after one (1) month. If amenable, PPO should immediately install water meter charge to the household concerned.
