Pres. Bernardo was glad to report to the Board that the buildings for the Regional Training Center for Rural Development for the Visayas region, one of the five centers in the country, has been completed.

He advanced the information that Minister Arturo R. Tanco, Jr. accepted the invitation as Guest Speaker in the inauguration of the RTC-RD complex, although Minister Tanco suggested that, if the Root Crop Research Center building could be inaugurated, President Marcos should be invited to be the guest speaker.

Hon. Lawas wanted to know more about the regional training program in ViSCA; so, Pres. Bernardo outlined in general terms the thrusts for the training programs which center on the training of extension agents in the region, based on regional area isolates, considering homogenous areas with common or similar resources.

Prerequisite: English 12 3 hours a week (lecture) Credit: 3 units

#### Justification:

It is a fact that the methods used in conducting research and the style being followed in preparing the manuscript in the social, biological and physical sciences vary. However, when English 13 was instituted in 1975, ViSCA did not have yet qualified technical staff who can teach a course in research in the different departments. Thus, students had to be grouped together in an English class and the teacher had to put equal emphasis on subject matters applicable to different fields instead of concentrating more on topics that each group of students needs. As can be expected, therefore, the students after finishing the course still find much difficulty in preparing their thesis outlines, more so in preparing the manuscripts.

To date, at least three technical departments have offered a course in research for two semesters already as a required major course or an extra major subject labelled "Special Topics." Both the thesis advisers and advisees found the course very helpful. Therefore, now that some departments already have staff members who can teach a research course, it is hereby proposed that said course be instituted. It is proposed further that the departments concerned be given the option either to continue requiring their major students to take English 13 (if they are not yet ready to offer the research course), offer the research course for their major students, or have them take the course in other technical departments, whicheve arrangement would be most advantageous to the major students and their departments.

### VISCA ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

# A PROPOSAL TO RAISE THE VISCA ENTRANCE SCHOLARS! MONTHLY STIPEND

To encourage more deserving students, particularly those who will successfully hurdle the ViSCA Admission Test (ViSCAAT), to come and study at ViSCA and take advantage of the quality education that now awaits them, it is proposed that the ViSCA Entrance Scholars' monthly stipend be raised.

Specifically, it is proposed to raise the entrance scholars monthly stipend from \$200 per month to \$300 per month for full-scholarship and from \$100 per month to \$200 at least per month for partial scholarship.

It is further proposed that, 50 slots for college entrance scholarships be reserved for the school year, 1979-80, i.e., 10 slots for full-scholarship and 40 slots for partial-scholarship. Also proposed are book allowance of \$200/semester/term and free school fees.

# Justification

last school year, 1978-79, the ViSCA Admission Test (ViSCAAT) was administered to high school graduates in some 16 testing centers in the Visayas and Mindanao. The top 75 who took the test were informed of their admission and scholarship but, to our disappointment, only 16, or 21%, came to enroll.

It was observed that the top students got 2 or more other scholarship tests and selected those that offered better privileges with bigger stipend.

By raising the monthly stipend for the ViSCA Entrance Scholarship, it is hoped that more deserving students will finally come to ViSCA; hence, this proposal to raise the scholars' monthly stipend, effective this year.\*
