Methodologies." Basically this training is conducted to promote entrepreneurship among poor and vulnerable communities as well as help micro entrepreneurs, especially farmers, to improve their business practices. The orientation session runs up to 3 hours.

The President indicated that in his e-mail reply to Mr. Tuca, that Mr. Tuca coordinate activities during his visit with Prof. Efren B. Saz and Dr. Antonio P. Abamo who have been assigned as the contact persons for VSU. What is needed now is to identify the venue for the orientation as well as the participants for this orientation. Some staff from the satellite campuses should be included in the list of participants. Of course, snacks will be served, as usual.

Dr. Abamo requested for an OP memorandum to mobilize resources as well as identify all prospective participants.

2. Regional RDE Meeting

The President informed the Council that there will be a Regional RDE Meeting here in the Main Campus on 11-12 December 2014. The President emphasized that Dr. Patricio Failon of PCAARRD might come which means that he needs to be back in campus by then from Thailand.

3. Participation in the Design Thinking Workshop for Visayas SUCs

The President informed the Council there will be a Design Thinking in Education Workshop Unlocking Innovations in Teaching and Leaning this coming 03-05 December 2014 to be held at City Suites, F. Ramos St., Cebu City.

The President explained that the workshop is a training and capability development program for educators. VSU has been allotted four (4) slots.

The Council decided to send two (2) participants from the CAS and another two (2) from Education. The Council decided that the four participants to said workshop will be the Dean of the CAS, Dr. Remberto A. Patindol and another faculty, while for Education, it will be Dr. Lijuera J. Cuadra and Prof. Herbina Mollejon (VSU Villaba).

4. Participation in the DA-BAR Funded Workshop: Development of Decisions Support Tools on Sustainable Land Development

The President informed the Council that the Bureau of Soils and Water Management in partnership with the Philippine Overview of Conservation approaches and Technologies (PhilCAT) member institutions, is currently implementing a project:

"Development of Decision Support Tools on Sustainable Land Management as a Key to

Address Biotic Stress Areas Vulnerable to Climate Change."

The President informed the Council that in the 2015 GAA, VSU was given P19 million for climate change. Director Silvino Tejada, Director II of the Bureau of Soils and Water Management informed the OP that his Office has implemented a new project funded by the DA-BAR entitled: "Development of Decision Support Tools on Sustainable Land Management as a Key to Address Biotic Stress Areas Vulnerable to Climate Change."

This initiative by the Bureau of Soils and Water Management is important to VSU because Leyte Island is very vulnerable to climate change. This project is funded by the DA-BAR and seeks to develop sustainable land management (SLM) decision tools for combatting land degradation and considering the effects of climate change by raising awareness, forging partnerships and development of SLM knowledge management. In the process, the project envisions that the SLM best practices will be documented and assessed using internationally accepted tools and methodologies and generate various knowledge products like: Overview Books on SLM; SLM Success Stories; Posters; Flyers as decisions support tools on SLM.

The President informed the Council that there will be a SLM seminar/workshop to be held at the VSU Pavilion Conference Hall, VSU Main Campus this coming 03 December 2014 and that Dir. Tejada is requesting that for the Opening Remarks, the President or representative deliver it.

President Bacusmo indicated that he will not be in campus on that day since he will be attending the BOR Meeting at the CHED Central Office in UP Diliman, Quezon City. The President requested Dr. Victor B. Asio to give the Opening Remarks.

5. Second JICA Mission: Assessment of the Current Status and Potential Development of R and D per Discipline

The President informed the Council that the OP received an e-mail message from Ms. Gelyn T. Lamarosa that some JICA representatives will be visiting the University this coming 03-05 December 2014 for the purpose of interviewing the Research Officer

of Baybay City LGU as well as ask the Deans regarding the academic programs that we submitted to JICA for consideration, namely: engineering, agriculture, biotechnology and a few more.

The President pointed out that Dr. Edgardo E. Tulin has represented VSU during the First Study Mission and requested Dr. Tulin to explain to the Council what this is all about.

Dr. Tulin explained that the First Study Mission involved three (3) Universities: UPLB, VSU and MSU-IIT. The objective of this mission was to "get an initial picture of the status of higher education of Universities especially in the fields of engineering, agriculture, biotechnology, and a few others. JICA is also very keen on Civil Engineering, as an academic program.

Dr. Tulin narrated that he already submitted the data requested by JICA covering the First Study Mission including the Strategic Planning sessions, faculty profiles, student profiles and other data. The reason for the second visit is to ask the Deans of the degree programs submitted earlier about possible R and D collaborations. The two (2) JICA personnel coming over include Ms. Maki Makiko and a Filipino and will be taking the 11:00 AM flight from Manila. They will conduct the interview on 04 December 2014, with the University scheduled for a morning interview and the Baybay LGU in the afternoon.

Prof. Ophelia D. Velarde informed the President and the Council that the JICA will be looking at seven (7) preferred disciplines for this second mission.

The President inquired who will be interviewed by the JICA for VSU.

Prof. Velarde indicated that Dr. Othello B. Capuno, VP for Research and Extension, Dr. Tulin, and Dr. Guarte will be interviewed.

Dr. Tulin commented that he will be attending the BOR Meeting on 03 December 2014 and will not be in campus for the said interview.

Prof. Velarde mentioned that the JICA team had expressed preference in staying inside the campus rather than in Baybay, if possible.

President Bacusmo indicated that these JICA personnel should be given accommodation by the University, possibly in the Apartelle.

Prof. Alan B. Loreto requested for the names of the incoming JICA guests so that they can be given rooms since all lodging facilities are going to be occupied by the participants of the Climate Change workshop.

President Bacusmo indicated that he would like to suggest the inclusion of Rootcrop Processing in the R and D agenda for possible JICA funding.

6. Possible Partnership between the Florida International University (FIU) and VSU on Disaster Risk Reduction, Typhoon and Storm Surge Research, and Other Extreme Related Issues

The President informed the Council that the CHED Chairperson, Dr. Patricia B. Licuanan referred to the OP a report from the Philippine Embassy in Washington D.C., that the Florida International University (FIU) is interested in developing partnerships with Philippine Higher Education Institutions particularly on disaster risk reduction, typhoon and storm surge research, and other extreme even related issues.

The President informed the Council that the FIU is a leading research institution in hurricane mitigation and is the only public research University offering Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral degrees in many fields in Miami, Florida. FIU is listed as one of the best colleges for 2014 in Business Programs by the US News and World Reports.

The President informed the Council that he already wrote a formal letter to Dr. Licuanan dated 16 October 2014 indicating that VSU is very interested to develop a partnership with FIU in R and D in Huricane Mitigation and in other Academic Fields.

7. Water Related Initiatives with the Republic of Czechoslovakia for the Establishment of a Water Purification Plant

The President informed the Council that there were many requirements attendant to water testing including water quality, mineral content, and others. VSU informed the Czech Embassy that there were a number of laboratory tests that VSU could not perform. Thus, VSU sent some of the water samples to an outside laboratory (Fast Lab) in Cebu for specific tests.

The President explained that the reason behind all these tests is to ascertain that the water quality of water used inside the campus is safe considering that the campus population is growing very fast and so, VSU is tapping into other sources, to augment existing sources. The University is also envisioning on selling bottled water in Baybay and elsewhere, thus, the need to determine quality of the water.

Currently, commercial water filtration utilizes "reverse-osmosis" technology. Hopefully, VSU will be able to produce "mineral water" which is healthier than "spring water".

The President informed the Council that he just received the results of the water analysis from Fast Labs, as follows: "According to the analysis of water samples, there is very low mineralization, and it is like rainwater. So, it is not drinkable without mineralization per European standards." The President explained that the European standard requires at least 200 ppm of minerals to be present in the water. However, mineral water is also "hard" on the kidneys since these will have to be filtered out of the body through the kidneys. In VSU, the bottled water is really spring water. The President mentioned that Dr. Feliciano Sinon has submitted a concept paper: Establishment of VSU Purification System: A Joint Project of the Mendellin University of the Republic of Czechoslovakia and the Visayas State University, Republic of the Philippines. This proposal will be endorsed to the Czech embassy before the end of the month for the undertaking.

8. Establishment of a Mini-Hydro Power Plant within the VSU Main Campus

The President informed the Council VSU has permitted the personnel of Mr. Alvarez to conduct some hydrologic studies on the Lago lago river to determine if the water flow is sufficient for the construction of a mini hydro-electric plant. Based on the results of their studies, the water flow in the Lago lago river will be able to generate about 250 kW of electricity which is quite small compare to the needs of the University but will be more than enough to power a small building. The President mentioned that is worth trying.

9. Statement of the CHED on Filipino and the Revised General Education Curriculum

The President informed the Council that the CHED is now encouraging the production of Course Syllabi in Pilipino. This new CHED initiative is embodied in a

1 letter from CHED Chairperson Patricia Licuanan. In the Basic Education, the syllabi are 2 now written in the "mother tongue" which is also difficult to do. 3 The President indicated that all UADCO members will be given a copy of this 4 new CHED initiative. 10. Invitation from CHED RO-8 and Leyte Normal University to attend Conference on 5 Waray Literary Works 7 The President informed the Council the CHED Regional Office 8 and the Leyte 8 Normal University (LNU) have announced the holding of a Conference on Waray Literary works this coming 09-11 December 2014 and are inviting faculty and students 9 to attend this conference. The President indicated that he will ask the DLABS to look 10 11 into this. 12 11. DOST-Balik Scientist Program The President informed the Council that the PCAARRD has sent a letter 13 inquiring whether the VSU has some foreign-based scientists in mind who can assist the 14 University in the implementation of its strategic R & D programs. 15 The President requested all UACO members to immediately inform OP if they 16 have anybody in mind so that they could be invited by the DOST under the Balik 17 18 Scientist program. 12. Invitation from the Asian Productivity Organization (APO) 19 20 The President informed the Council that the Asian Productivity Organization (APO) will be conducting a "Self-Learning Course on Good Agricultural Practices 21 (GAP) for Increasing Farm Productivity, Self-Sustainable Production, and Market 22 Access" this coming 01 December 2014 to 30 April 2015. 23

The President indicated that the structured self-learning course will be implemented through APO's dedicated E-learning websites. Interested participants can register on these websites and create their own accounts Registration starts on 01 December 2014 until 31 April 2015. The whole course runs for about three (3) months.

The President indicated that all the Dean of Satellite Campuses should enroll in this free on-line program.

13. Letter from the COA Resident Auditor on Submission of Financial Report for the P1.2 million Grant from the BFAR for the Hatchery Establishment

The President informed the Council that the BFAR gave the Main Campus and the Tolosa Campus P1.2 million each for the construction of a fish hatchery. In the Main Campus, only about P1,000.00 is left from said BFAR funds. The Tolosa Campus has to ascertain the balance of such a fund.

The President indicated that the COA has requested for the report on utilization of this fund especially because this is part of the DAP funds that is currently being audited. The COA letter emphasized "That for those schools with damaged projects, the school has to submit a damage report and to request for relief from property accountability to the school's Resident Auditor. For those schools whose reports are for still pending for verification, to also submit it to the Resident COA Auditor. Lastly, please furnish a copy of the endorsement to Ms. Anne T. Apa, DA-COA Team Leader."

The President informed Dr. Lauzon and Dr. Balbarino that they will be given copies of the COA letter so that they can also prepare the needed reports.

14. Issues Related to Assignment of Classrooms to Classes with more than 50 Students

The President informed the Council there have been many complaints aired about small classrooms being assigned to subjects with more than 50 students. The classrooms at the DLABS definitely cannot accommodate 50 students since it was envisioned that it will accommodate a maximum of only 35 students.

The President emphasized that when the University Library transfers to the new building, the space will be subdivided into classrooms which will be enough to seat up at least 50 students to 55 students.

15. Conference on Green Technologies for Eco-Systems Rehabilitation and Restoration in the Bicol University College of Agriculture and Forestry

The President informed the Council that the Bicol University College of Agriculture and Forestry (BUCAF) will be holding a "Conference on Green Technologies for Eco-Systems Rehabilitation and Restoration".

V. ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. Climate Change Training/Workshop from 02-05 December 2014

President Bacusmo reminded the Council that the Climate Change
Training/Workshop will be conducted here in the Main Campus this coming 02-05
December 2014.

2. Lighting Ceremony (Dec. 1) and Christmas Party (Dec. 19)

President Bacusmo reminded the UADCO members to attend the Christmas Lighting Ceremony on 01 December 2014 and the University-wide Christmas Party this coming 19 December 2014.

3. Request of Deputy Director de Guzman

President Bacusmo informed the Council that DOST Deputy Director-General Dr. Matet de Guzman informed the University that it is accepting R & D proposals in the field of biotechnology for immediate funding as said agency still has about P100 million for awarding in 2014.

Dr. de Guzman requested VSU to come up with at least three (3) proposals for submission not later than 03 December 2014.

Dr. Capuno commented that the other fields included, other than biotechnology, are livestock, jackfruit, abaca, fisheries/aquaculture.

4. Campus Visit by the Environmental Management Bureau

Prof. Manolo B. Loreto informed the council that the Environmental Management Bureau (EMB) together with some officials of SMART Communications will be visiting the campus this December. The SMART officials will be conducting some kind of campus awareness regarding their services to our students. The EMB, on the other hand, will be looking around since the Main Campus has been declared an ecofriendly campus.

The President indicated that the visit of the EMB should be properly coordinated as they may visit other eco-friendly facilities inside the campus like the Alternative Non-conventional Energy Center (ANEC) but also steered away from other sites like the

1	garbage dulip which still needs to be worked on. Further, the signages around the
2	campus like the No Smoking signages, especially those that have been badly damaged
3.	have to be replaced. Further, the comfort rooms along the highway (near the Guard Pos
4	I) have to be cleaned.
5	Dr. Asio also suggested that the road from the College of Veterinary Medicine
6	going to the Department of Animal Science be cleaned as there are a lot of garbage
7	strewn all over the said road.
8	4. <u>Visit of KOICA Representatives at the Tolosa Campus on 03 December 2014</u>
9	The President informed the Council and the Dean of the VSU Tolosa that four
10	(4) KOICA officials will be visiting the Tolosa Campus starting 03 December 2014. Dr
11	Guarte is taking care of the preparations for the visit of the KOICA officials.
12	The President indicated that it is hoped that after the visit, there will be a signing
13	of the MOA for the start of the US\$4.0 mil. infrastructure project financed by KOICA.
