REGISTRATION FEE FOR COMPLETION OF THESIS

Rationale

It has been observed that some college students could not complete their theses on time and they, therefore, have to reenroll said subject in order to entitle them to faculty time/service and the use of college facilities. There are instances, however, when students have their thesis manuscripts already approved but they still have to do finishing touches, including multiplication and binding of the thesis. In such a case, there will be no more need for the services of the adviser(s) nor the use of college facilities.

The existing College policy requires a graduating student who has finished all the academic requirements for the ocurse except his thesis to enroll for the next term and pays P50.00 per term, excluding special fees for publication, insurance, charity, and cultural. After this grace period, if reenrolment of the thesis is necessary, the student pays P100.00 per term, excluding the required special fees. Such a practice has been found disadvantageous to the students; hence, the following proposal:

Proposal:

A graduating student (graduate or undergraduate) who has finished all the academic requirements for the course except his thesis, but which has been approved by his adviser(s), shall enroll for the next term and page a special thesis fee of P20:00 per term, for a maximum of two terms only, Provided, That all the corresponding 6 units for the subject have been registered in the previous semesters. Provided further, That the adviser(s) certifies (certify) that the student shall no longer use college facilities; otherwise, the thesis shall be consilered a regular 3-unit subject and the student page the corresponding comprehensive fee, plus the required specialfees for publication, insurance, charity, and cultural. This condition to continue until he completes the thesis requirement.

SERVICE FEE FOR FOREIGN TRAINESS

Rationale

MEC Order No. 42, s. 1979 defines foreign students as ". . . aliens belonging to or owing allegiance to a country other than the Philippines who will study in any educational institution recognized or owned by the government of the Philippines, to include researchers, trainees, grantees, scholars, and other similar categories, who will conduct research work in any other government/private department or agency, or who will study in any special training institution or center in the country."

Foreign students come to the Philippines either to earn a degree or merely undergo special training, practicum/field practice, or even conduct research work, and the like. Whatever kind of study that these foreign students will undertake, it is necessary for the admitting institution/agency to extend/provide support in the form of service or field/laboratory equipment to effect the study.

For the second time, German students in a group of three will come to ViSCA to undergo field practice in the production of root crops. The Philippine Root Crop Research and Training Center at ViSCA has been providing the personnel and field implement for their field practice here. The College can no longer afford to attend to foreign students free of charge.

Proposal

Foreign students who come to ViSCA to study (other than earn a degree) in any special training, field practice/practicum, research work, and the like, shall be charged a training fee of \$1,500.00 per term of 6 months, to be paid in advance. The training fee shall cover the cost of supplies and materials and honoraria of the attending faculty/staff members. This shall take effect in the First semester, SY 1981-1982.

Approved Guidelines for "Overtime Work" 1981-82

It may seem unfair to require overtime work during evenings, weekends and holidays, particularly during Christmas season, but many urgent things must be accomplished in ViSCA this month and early next year. We must make our development plans for 1983 and 1984 which should serve as bases for us to formulate our budgetary needs for 1983 and 1984. The budget proposal must be submitted to the Ministry of the Budget not later than January 10, 1982.

In addition to these, the academic staff must complete the revisions and improvement of their course syllabi an/or laboratory manuals. Details of research project proposals considered high priority by PCARR or ViCARP must be worked out and submitted. Those in the field of extension must review the College extension program and also submit their proposals for whort training courses and other extension activities for 1982.

To facilitate all of these, overtime work in December and January up to the equivalent of two weeks shall be allowed for both academic and administrative staff.

 - b. Budget Preparation for 1983 & 1984 Dr. Samuel S. Go and Coordinators
 Dir. Francisco G. Bascug
 Ms. Norma V. Cala -Asst. Coor.
 - c. Course syllabi (not just course outline) or laboratory manuals
- -Dr. E. N. Bernardo -Coordinator Prof. A. F. Duatin -Asst. Ccor.
- d. Research Project Proposals
- -Dr. F. A. Bernardo -Coordinator Prof. F. G. Villamayor-Asst, Coor.
- e. Review of Extension Program and Training Course Proposals
- -Dr. Eliseo R. Ponce -Coordinator
- f. Other special assignments
- Other special assignments to the staff may be made by the unit heads, subject to the approval by the College President/Vice President.

- 3. Some staff members may work, on several projects. In such cases the unit head concerned should indicate their main responsibility, the output for which they shall be evaluated by the unit head and the coordinators (use attached form).
- 4. Since a great demand for typing services is anticipated, all heads of administrative units must make their typists available to academic staff members. The heads of offices shall coordinate typing jobs within his/her unit.
- 5. All outputs must be submitted to the coordinators through the unit head concerned. Upon submission of satisfactory outputs, the coordinators shall issue certifications of completion which shall be the bases for overtime payment of the academic staff and key administrative staff/heads of units.
- 6. Overtime payment for this special case shall be based on output rather than time spent on the job.
- 7. Accomplishments shall be considered team outputs of the units concerned following the philosophy that everyone contributes to the total efforts of the units. All administrative and support staff shall, therefore, be entitled to the equivalent of two week overtime pay upon completion of work of the academic staff. However, the head of office must certify who among the administrative staff participated actively and did his/her share during overtime work. This certification shall serve as the basis for overtime payment of the administrative staff.
- 8. Overtime work may be done during evenings, weekends or holidays. If necessary, work may be done at home, in the library or elsewhere outside of the office.
- 9. All works mentioned in the first two paragraphs must be accomplished not later than January 10, 1982. Overtime pay for these shall therefore be for the period beginning December 1, 1981 to January 10, 1982.
- 10. This policy on overtime work covers only all personnel under VisCA fund except those, under capital outlay. Because of fund shortage, those under capital outlay can render overtime only for one week.
- 11. Overtime pay for this purpose for any regular employee shall be equivalent to one half of his monthly salary while for anyone on casual basis, equivalent to 14 days of work, subject to COA rules and regulations.

RECLASSIFICATION OF THE VISCA ACADEMIC PERSONNEL STARTING IN JANUARY 1982

Dackground Information

A general reclassification of the ViSCA academic personnel was conducted sometime in June 1981. The recommendation for the said reclassification/upgrading of academic personnel, who qualified for higher ranks in accordance with the approved criteria of equivalents of the College, was approved by the Board under Resolution No. 41, s. 1981.

The said reclassification could not be implemented in 1981 as approved, because of budgetary rules disallowing the adjustment and payment of salaries beyond the maximum set by the CCPC. However, Director Ofelada of OCPC has assured the ViSCA President that a Budget Circular will be issued late this year to allow promotion beyond the maximum step in the salary scale.

Proposal

It is proposed that the College be allowed to implement the approved reclassification/upgrading of the ViSCA academic personnel in accordance with Board Resolution No. 41, s. 1981, and allowing the use of the amount set aside for this purpose, effective January 1, 1982, subject to the provisions of National Budget Circular No. 308.

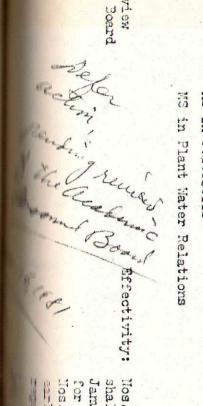
