

In view of the conversion of the BS in Ag. 

Dear Madam President:

The original proposal submitted by the Dept. of Family and Consumer Sciences to the University Curriculum Committee for review was a combination of adoption of existing courses (6 subjects) and change of course codes (two letter to four letter) (25 subjects) of the course offerings. The former was not merely a change from Educ to Prof Ed but the committee found that some descriptive titles and Course Number were also different. Meanwhile, it was also learned by the committee that the department is presently pursuing general revision of its BSHE curriculum, thus in the light of these developments, the committee advised the department chairman to do two things: 1) Write a letter addressed to the President thru channels for adoption of existing Prof Ed courses which are already offered at the Dept. of Science Education in lieu of the old Educ courses, hence this letter; and 2) Incorporate the changes in course codes from two letter to four letter to the proposal which is now under revision.
